## Handling Government Departments (in common law)

Common law is different from "English Common Law" practised by Barristers and Lawyers who in ignorance believe they are practising "common law" but it is only the rules and practises of the Law Society (*a private organisation*).

In Australia, Canada, the United Kingdom, and the United States; common law is supreme; standing above Acts of Parliament, codes, rules, and policies of all Government agencies. The charter of Government is to protect the property and uphold the rights of man where common law is all a man has to properly secure his rights when dealing with any branch of Government.

Unless there is a claim from a man you have done something wrong there is no case to answer. Government departments can only make complaints and unless there is a man who will claim under oath he is owed compensation for a debt, or that by your actions or inactions he has been harmed, or trespassed against, any case relating to such matters has to be discharged.

If a 'man' from any Government department comes onto your property and is asked to leave; but stays; he is trespassing; or; any man who has made it his intention to come onto your property; expressed either verbally, or by way of correspondence; can be refused entry or be asked to put up a bond i.e. "the sum of one-million five-hundred-thousand dollars (\$1,500,000)" paid into an escrow, or held in trust by a family Solicitor as surety in case of wrongful prosecution, or because of damage that may occur to your property while such a man is on your property; and kept for such period as you determine to your satisfaction such that your property has remained whole and your rights have been upheld.

The only time a man is bound by a set of rules is where he has expressly agreed to the terms and conditions of a contract. If any man issues orders to another man ie. "you are required to erect a fence to our satisfaction" because a man cannot be ordered to do anything without fare and just compensation such a man (a Public Servant) can be told "I do not believe I have a standing obligation under any contract; and require what it is you wish be placed in the form of an order so I can issue a true bill on completion of the said order; and where carrying out such an order is beyond my means require such advance payments necessary to purchase materials and or hire trades and services needed to complete said order or orders"

For the purposes of business you can state that for the ease of carrying on your affairs you maintain a license as a tool only and/or follow certain standards as a guide where at all times; as is your right; your observance of such standards implies no undertaking to be bound by the terms and conditions of a contract where you are nothing other than a man making available your property in return for just monetary compensation.

Note: never accept titles in nobility i.e. Mr, Mrs, Sir, Your Grace, or as a person identified by a job description, or profession, ie "you are a Carpenter" or "you are a driver" or Doctor or Dentist; at all times to remain in common law and beyond the jurisdiction of statute you are nothing other than a man.
